



UCR vs. NIBRS

What does it mean?


- **UCR (Uniform Crime Reporting)** is the reporting method established in 1929 by the FBI. UCR counts *only the most serious crime in any given incident*. UCR only measured 8 offense types.
- **NIBRS (National Incident Based Reporting System)** was established in the 1980s and is now the standard reporting method in Washington State. NIBRS collects more detailed information about incidents, and counts every crime from a specific incident. NIBRS collects information on 23 offense types, with relational information on offense type, property stolen, victim, offender, arrest information and more.
- **LPD crime stats were reported in UCR until 2011, when we began using NIBRS. Because the way that crimes are counted in each system is so different, our comparative stats this year are only illustrating the last 2 years using the NIBRS model.**



Notable changes from 2011-2012

- Burglaries +41%
- Robberies +42%
- Forced sex offenses -23%
- Arson -35%
- Auto theft -27%
- Aggravated assaults -16%
- Domestic violence +13%
- Adult arrests +21%
- Juvenile arrests +15%
- DUI arrests +10%
- Calls for service +8%


Longview Crime Rate 2011-2012


2012 NIBRS Persons Crime Rate



*Longview had 1 homicide in 2012



Calls for Service 5 Year Trend




Calls for service are up 17% from 2008 to 2012

This does not include most self initiated activity such as traffic stops.

LPD responded to 40 **shoplift of liquor** calls from June 1 - Dec 31, 2012.

Traffic Statistics



- Traffic accidents are down 3% from 2011
- Traffic citations are up 47% from 2011
- DDACTS was implemented in June 2012, we had 2 traffic officers most of 2012
- Photo enforcement tickets are down 60% from 2011
- Red light cameras were turned off on 2.14.12

Grants and Volunteers

- Longview Police Department received grant funding on several grants in 2012. Those funds came from several different sources and are often multiple year grants. The amounts listed below are for the entire grant period.
- Washington State Auto Theft Prevention Authority - \$25,000
- Washington State Traffic Safety Commission - \$3,387
- DOJ, Office of Justice Programs: Bullet Proof Vest program - \$4,538
- Secure Our Schools - \$166,700
- Justice Assistance Grant (Local) - \$13,902
- Justice Assistant Grant (Recover) - \$193,159
- Registered Sex Offender Grant - \$51,940
- COPS Hiring Grant - \$663,984
