PLANNING ACTIVITY


Historic Preservation Committee completed review and approved an interpretive panel for the log arch at Lake Sacajawea. Work for this is expected to begin in the Spring.

The Planning Division completed work and review on two short plat applications.

In addition, 22 new home occupation business licenses were approved, and 4 new regular business licenses were approved by zoning.

BUILDING AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY

- 145 permits issued for CED and 29 permits issued in tandem with Public Works.
- 1 permit for new Single-Family Dwelling issued.
- 1 permit for a new Multifamily 4-plex building at 285 22ND AVE issued.
- 4 tenant improvement permits issued to local businesses throughout Longview for a total valuation of \$262,000.

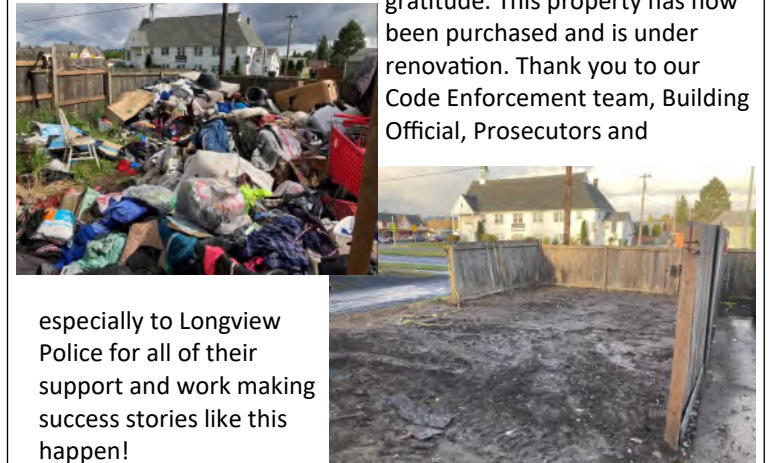
